Trade Jobs as Careers

Government Jobs

- Individuals with a criminal record are still eligible for government work, the only exclusionary felony being treason.
- Other criminal backgrounds evaluated on the relevancy of the crime to the job at hand, along with several other factors.

USAjobs.org, the primary site for government job seekers, lists the following considerations:

- Your character traits and conduct.
- Potential conflicts between your criminal conduct and the core job duties.
- Potential conflicts between your employment and interests of national security.
- The nature, seriousness, and circumstance of your criminal activity.
- How long it has been since your criminal activity.
- Rehabilitation or efforts toward rehabilitation.

Traditional Employment


